- 1. Exploring a more fair, effective, and transformative impact on racial equity and social justice within the education philanthropy and the social impact ecosystem in North Carolina,
- 2. examining the unfulfilled promise of a <u>sound basic education</u> per *Leandro v. State*, including how to ensure all students have access to high-quality academic content, a broad range of opportunities, activities and experiences and diverse and effective educators,
- 3. investing and sustaining funding that helps ensure Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC) students in North Carolina have access to high-quality education,
- 4. maintaining a learning orientation during and between sessions,
- 5. sharing key learnings with their organizations and networks, and
- 6. using collective voice to name and address racial inequities in education philanthropy.

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
